Ribbons & Prizes

Agility, Jumpers, JDT & Champion of Champions: Ribbons and prizes to a minimum of 3rd place in each class/split.
Thereafter ribbons to at least 10% of entries and prizes to at least 5% of entries.

JDT Handler of the Year: Ribbon and prizes for the winners of each division and ribbons for runners-up.

Agility and Jumpers Finals: Ribbons and prizes for the winners of each height and medals and prizes for overall winners.

Top Dog: Ribbons and prizes for the Top Dog of each height.

Entry Information

Champion of Champions (CoC) Classes

Entry to the Agility CoC class is restricted to dogs with an Agility Champion, Agility Grand Champion, or Agility Supreme Champion title.

Entry to the Jumpers CoC class is restricted to dogs with a Jumpers Champion, Jumpers Grand Champion, or Jumpers Supreme Champion title.

Junior Dog Training (JDT) Classes

JDT Jumpers is open to all handlers who meet the following criteria:

JDT Beginners is open to any child who has not achieved a placing first to third in any standard championship event with any dog at any time.

JDT Experienced is open to any child who has achieved a placing first to third in any standard championship event with any dog at any time.

JDT Handler of the Year Competition

Entrants must be members of JDT and have qualified throughout the year.

A dog can run more than once if qualified more than once, such as a family dog which qualifies with two children.

Under 12 years. To qualify, children must be under 12 years on 1 November 2024 and have achieved two clear rounds with the dog in any standard Agility Championship class (Starters, Novice, Intermediate, Senior) between 1st November 2024 and 31st August 2025.

12 years and over - Novice. To qualify, children must be over 12 years old on 1st November 2024 and not turn 20 years before the final at NZDAC 2025 and have achieved two clear rounds with the dog in a Novice class at Championship level between 1st November 2024 and 31st August 2025.

12 years and over - Advanced. To qualify, children must be over 12 years old on 1st November 2024 and not turn 20 years before the final at NZDAC 2025 and have achieved two clear rounds with the dog in an Intermediate/Senior class at Championship level between 1st November 2024 and 31st August 2025.

Club Teams Competition

Clubs may enter a maximum of two teams. All members of a team must be from the same club. A handler and dog can only be in one team.

Teams will comprise three dogs and three handlers. Team members can be entered into any of the four Agility classes (Starters, Novice, Intermediate, Senior).

However, no more than two dogs are eligible for the same class in any one team.

The entry form is in the NZDAC section of the Dog Agility website. Entries will close 1st October 2025.
